### Keynote speaker Farid Esack

Professor Farid Esack is a South African Muslim Theologian who cut his teeth in the South

African struggle for liberation. He studied in Pakistan, the UK and Germany and is the author of a number of books on Islam and Islam, Gender Justice, Liberation Theology, Religion & AIDS and Qur'anic Hermeneutics. An anti-apartheid activist in his youth, Esack was appointed a National Commissioner on Gender Equality by President Nelson Mandela after the fall of apartheid. He has lectured at universities around the world including Hamburg, Columbia, and Harvard, and is currently a professor of Islamic Studies at the Univer-



sity of Johannesburg. He continues his work as an activist through Positive Muslims, an organization working with Muslims who are HIV positive in South Africa, and through the several development boards on which he serves in South Africa and internationally.
